PRESIDENT'S CORNER





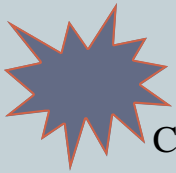
Here are the highlights:



MO-AHEAD is pleased to announce that **Jane Jarrow** will lead two audio conferences in the months to come. On November 5th, 2009 (1:30 – 3:00pm), Jane will host a session entitled: YOUR STUDENTS ARE ONLINE, EVEN IF YOUR CLASSES ARE NOT!!! She will talk about ways to best work with students with disabilities in hybrid classes (classes that occur both in-person and on Blackboard or some other Internet forum). On February 4th (1:30 – 3:00pm), Jane will lead us in a discussion called: PLAYING UNDER THE NEW RULES. Here, she will discuss the impact of the ADA and latest DOJ regulations, the latter of which will hopefully be announced a number of weeks prior to the audio conference. Registration information will be sent on the listserv in the weeks to come. These topics were specifically selected with the hope that campus MO-AHEAD members will invite faculty and administrators to listen in on the sessions.



As a way of supporting members very new to the field, MO-AHEAD will conduct occasional audio conferences for new disability service providers. The first such **audio conference** will be **September 17th from 1:30 – 3:00pm**. More information will be sent via the listserv. If you are new to the field, would like to hear about some of the basic things that you need to know to make the office run well, and would like to ask questions to people who have been at it awhile, please consider taking advantage of this opportunity.



Continuing with the support theme, MO-AHEAD is creating a mentorship program for service providers who would like to have the opportunity to converse with one of our more experienced MO-AHEAD members. We are not defining who is eligible to use a mentor but will leave that up to you. At this time, a pool of mentors from the executive board and the membership at large has been organized and is ready to roll. Mentors will commit to being available at least once monthly for phone conversations and then by email as often as needed. The project commences in Denver, CO in early August. 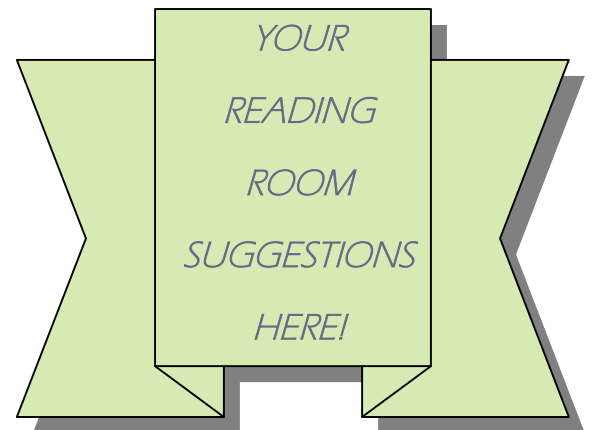

MO-AHEAD Transition Training

What do over 100 Division of Vocational Rehabilitation counselors throughout the State of Missouri have in common? All attended a Transition to College for Students with Disabilities Training presented by MO AHEAD. It all started with a friendly conversation between Barb Hammer of UM-Columbia and a DVR administrator. Both agreed that the training would be of benefit to DVR counselors and the rest is history. Full day trainings were conducted in Springfield, Cape Girardeau, Jefferson City, St. Louis and Kansas City.

The training objective was to give participants information about transition issues faced by students with disabilities in higher education. Specific topics covered included: reasonable accommodations, legal requirements, preparation for college, self-advocacy, differences in services provided and resources.

Special thanks needs to go out to Kathy Kelly from DVR who facilitated the trainings. Presenters from MO AHEAD were, Julie Edwards, Ozarks Technical Community College, Amy Frieling, Crowder Community College, Adam Meyer, St. Louis University, Suelaine Matthews, St. Louis Community College, and Karen Blessman, Fort Zumwalt School District. The trainings were held between March 11th and June 5th.
